Many types of breakdowns are present in our patients – premature ruptures of defenses, empathic failures, and, most severely, when reality itself begins to fracture. Psychological growth can also come on the heels of great pain and turmoil. Often, we associate breakthroughs with healing and the development of insight, but glimpses of sadism, psychosis, and the id also break through carefully constructed facades. This course examines the nuances of these phenomena in a way unique to psychoanalysis, while also exploring the potential limits of psychoanalysis. We will also investigate what interdisciplinary ideas can enhance the breadth and depth of our thinking.

This introductory event to NCSPP's year-long Intensive Study Group (ISG) features the three instructors – Daniel Butler, Susana Winkel, and Deborah Melman – each describing their own approach to this year's theme: Psychoanalysis: Breakdown & Breakthrough. The course will explore clinical aspects of cultural, social, and political upheaval, creating space for clinicians to process, grapple, and play with experiences of and responses to the ever-shifting reality in which we and our patients find ourselves. Whether it is dissociative experiences linked to the ubiquity of technology or the vicissitudes of early developmental ruptures, one of our primary tasks as psychoanalytic clinicians is to find a vocabulary to describe breakdowns and breakthroughs as they occur in the clinical process. How do we conceptualize these fractures – how do we speak to them from within the therapeutic relationship?

Who gets to be a child? How does race play a role in how we view who a child is? Join us in thinking about these questions and more in this reading group, where we will analyze issues around adultification bias and white infantilization. Through case vignettes, participants will reflect and discuss how our child and adolescent treatments are fundamentally embedded within a particular cultural, historical, and political apparatus and that our understanding of our clients, our theory, and ourselves is inevitably impacted by our rooted-in socio-cultural-political surroundings.

**Daniel G. Butler, Ph.D., LMFT**, is a psychoanalytic candidate at PINC and graduate of UC Santa Cruz's History of Consciousness Program. He teaches at SFCP and Access Institute and serves on the editorial boards of *Studies in Gender and Sexuality* and *Journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association*. His private practice is in Hayes Valley.

**Annette V. Clarke, Ph.D.**, is a licensed clinical psychologist specializing in serious mental illness, diversity, community mental health, immigration and acculturation, mindfulness and meditation, and body positivity. A published author, researcher, and lecturer, her work includes Black and Black immigrant mental health, identity development, immigration, and acculturation, and cultural competency pedagogy.

**David Cushman, Psy.D.**, is a licensed clinical psychologist. He is a core faculty member of the PsyD program at CIIS and has a private practice in Oakland where he sees children, teens, adults, and couples. He worked in community settings for several years and has written and published on community mental health from a psychoanalytic perspective.

**Deborah Melman, Ph.D.**, is on the faculty at the Wright Institute, PINC, and SFCP. She has a private practice in Berkeley.

**Sydney Tan, Psy.D.**, is a clinical psychologist and psychoanalyst. She teaches seminars on Lacan and Freud, most recently at PINC, Access Institute, and SFCP, where she completed her psychoanalytic training and is a faculty member. Her film review, "The Films of Our Lives," was recently published in *fort da*, and several of her Latin translations can be found in *Impulse*. She maintains a private practice in San Francisco.

**Susana Winkel, Ph.D.**, received her psychoanalytic training at SFCP where she is faculty, and taught at UC Berkeley and Tsing-Hua University, in Beijing. A classically trained musician, she is interested in applying psychoanalysis to the study of music. Her private practice is in San Francisco and Oakland.

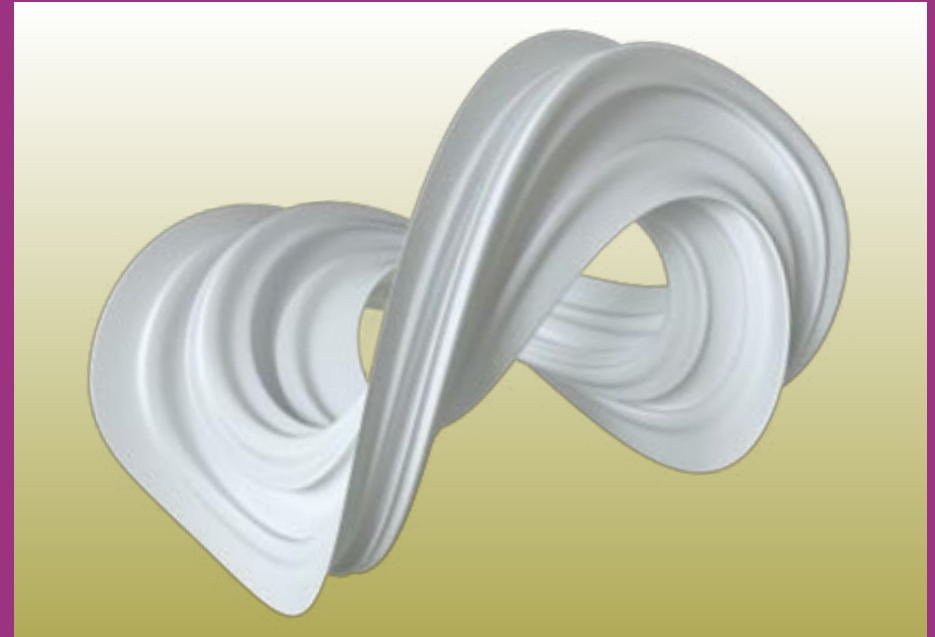
